BIRTH. On the 16th inst., the lady of Mr. David Krutich, of a son.

A boat belonging to the British brig Anne, left the shore on the 14th inst., for that vessel with Captain Hartley, the second mate, and 3 seamen and Mr. Richard Henry Davis, who was going to spend the day at sea, but not far from the vessel a piece of the hull separated. Mr. Davis with Captain Hartley's hat having fallen into the water and all hands simultaneously leaning over the boat's side in an effort to pick it up, the boat was capsized and Mr. Davis and two seamen were unfortunately drowned.

The survivors who cling to the boat were shortly after picked up by boats from a Spanish vessel lying in the rocks and from the Bremen brig Sauser, as likewise the body of the unfortunate Mr. Davis which had been caught by the hat by the second mate in his efforts to save him. The body of Mr. Davis was subsequently conveyed on board the Sauser and then to the shores on the 14th inst., and buried in the Protestant Cemetery. The bodies of the two seamen have not yet been found.
