MONTHLY RETROSPECT.

Of April it may be recorded with commendation, that it has added little or nothing to our existing stocks of raw materials and goods.

During the early part of the month, there was a brisk demand for the Province of Santa Fé, and also considerable quantities to that of Entre Rios.

Entirely new purchases have arrived from Cordoba, but it is difficult to fix them, as the deposit system and return duties of Montevideo hold out powerful, and, we fear, irresistible attractions.

At the same time these accidental causes have been aggravated, by the new depreciation during these last few months of paper currency, and a concomitant reaction in the rate of exchange.

To sell nothing, or sell at a loss is the only alternative; and when it may be preferable to submit to a contingent loss, say of ten per cent, or hazard a present one of twenty, in one, two or three months, it is a practical and perplexing question on which importers are called to decide.

The local demand during the period under consideration may be rated good; and retail dealers have been doing a comparatively brisk and satisfactory business.

In articles of daily consumption the market in general continues to be liberally supplied. Wine, sugar, tobacco and yerba very abundant.
