OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS.

[New Organization of the Bank and Mint of Buenos Ayres.]

BUENOS AYRES, OCT. 19, 1854.

The Senate and Chamber of Representatives met in General Assembly, have sanctioned the following with the validity and force of law.—
ART. I. The Directors of the Bank and Mint of Buenos Ayres, shall henceforth consist of sixteen Directors, to be appointed annually by the Government, who shall elect their own President, for the term of six months.
ART. II. The Directors shall form the Corresponding Code of Regulations, both for the Mint and Bank of Deposits and Discounts, which shall be submitted for the approval of the Government.
ART. III. They shall name the employees suitable for the administration of the establishment, and their salaries, with all the other necessary expenses, shall be voted annually by the Legislature, according to the estimate submitted by the Directors to the Government, and shall be deducted from the capital gains belonging to the Bank.
ART. IV. It shall also be an attribute of the Directors to fix the rate of discount, increasing or diminishing the same, as may seem expedient.
ART. V. It shall also be at liberty to pay a higher interest on judicial and private deposits than the minimum fixed by law, when considered advantageous to the Government to do so.
ART. VI. Deposits of money in the Bank, belonging to the State, or any branch of the Administration, shall bear no interest whatsoever.
ART. VII. The capital of the Bank shall be increased in the future, and presented only in bills, that are currently issued by the said establishment, of the machinery for printing money, and of what is not required, or may hereafter realize by the consent of bills.
ART. VIII. The Bank shall cancel all claims against the Government of whatever kind they may be, restoring the documents that may have been delivered.
ART. IX. The Bank shall not acquire other immovable property than what it has as present possession, or property of any kind, except that arising from the discount of bills.
ART. X. The Bank shall not be bound to issue credits beyond the amount that the Government be at liberty to dispose of the capital of the Bank, without the authorization of the Legislative Assembly.
ART. XI. The Bank in its transactions shall enjoy fiscal privileges.
ART. XII. Let it be communicated to the Executive Power.

MONTHLY RESPECT.

Like Pharaoh's lean kine that devoured the fat and well-favoured, political agitation in these young communities, appears to be the predestinated cancer-worm of industry, commerce, and social progress. The expectations centered in October have been doomed to a signal disappointment. With the exception of some public auctions, to clear off old stocks at what they will bring, very little has been done for the local market. The continued depreciation of our circulating medium, the difficulty of adjusting prices, and we must add, a tightness in the Money Market, arising from our competition, conspire to produce this result; with the chronic aggravation of a turbid horizon, so regards our inter-provincial relations.
The demand for the Interior Provinces has also been languishing especially during the latter part of the month. The inadequate means of transport from the Rosario to the interior, at the same time, and other general causes have a part, to which we shall have occasion to allude under a subsequent head. As all events the effect is notorious, be the cause or causes what they may.
Of the Import Market, as regards manufactured goods, we may safely affirm that it is abundantly supplied, and regularly assorted. Latterly the importations have been moderate, and it is to be hoped they will continue so for some time to come. With deposit, and all the appliances of frost, anything approaching to a glut, would be a fortunate event for all parties concerned. As matters stand, goods could not be pushed off except at a heavy sacrifice, and it is to be feared that some day it would tighten the screw on the retail market generally. Payments, we regret to say, are not so punctually made as we are accustomed, and though anything deserving the name of a crisis may be warded off, by the confidence and forbearance, of which we have not a notable and memorable illustration in circumstances all too gloomy and ominous, this chilling influence will have its effect in curtailing transactions in the mean time.

ARTICLES OF DAILY CONSUMPTION.—As may be gathered from our shipping list, we have had more than a fair average of arrivals, both from the United States and the Mediterranean. Whilst, with perhaps the only article of which there is a superabundance, and that has fallen below remunerating prices, Lumber, both American and Baltic, has declined a shade, but with a wide margin still in favour of the importer. Spirits and wines cling to their figures to which they have so long been accustomed. Rice in most markets has fallen below remunerating prices, but in our markets it is the only article which has held its own, and we last has reached the turning point, and we suspect wholesale prices must give way. In most other articles prices have fallen, and so high as to indicate no overstock. Building materials of all descriptions, may safely be said to be in the market. EXPORT PRODUCE.—Of ox and cow hides, no stocks of any consequence exist in the Baltimore and Liverpool markets. For this latter district, we believe nearly all the supplies brought in from the country districts have been cleared off. For this latter description, prices have rallied from 105 to about 112 current dollars, with a slight upward tendency. Horse hides are in only languid demand. Tallow remains firm, about late prices; and the stock in hand is considerably short for 100 pipes. Mares grease may be reported dull at late prices, and the same remarks may be applied to hair, bones and sheep skin. The stock produced by the news received from Europe in most articles has been almost entirely dissipated, and the market appears repressed. Latterly, very little has been done for the North American market.
Wool MARKET.—The residue of last year's clip is being cleared off, like other goods of season, which will be pretty general in the ensuing week, should the weather continue propitious. The proportion of wool washed exceeds the bare necessities, but all accounts agree that the flocks are in superior condition, and consequently, the quality of the clip will be above an ordinary average. Some sales have been closed; but with a reserve as to prices that remain in the hands of speculators, we give a current rate. We believe the reduction on the sales of prices will be found much less than was generally expected a month ago. In currency it may perhaps range from 10 to the percent, the intrinsic value of our currency, however, does not show any greater difference in favour of the exporter. The following may be regarded as the benefit result from a fluctuating medium,
