In Consequence of an agreement having been entered into by the agents of Ham-
burg cruising pilotage the schooner Cua-
zen has been built of account of the Gov-
ernment and will be started for this purpose without delay.

She carries the Government flag and the well known large ensign of the Hamburg Pilot gallies; during the night she will show a red light, and is also marked with No. 1 in black on her foremast. She is intended to cruise between the mouth of the Elbe, Borkum and Heligoland, in order to provide for the admission of the pilot gallies only if the latter is not in station, or can not transport any pilot.

Those vessels which take a cruising pilot fulfill thereby their pilot duty containing in §15. A. of the Pilot Regulations of the year 1858.

By hoisting a pilot flag on the foremast or a lantern at night, they give to understand that they want a cruising pilot.
The cruising pilot resigns the vessel at Cuxhaven to an examining pilot who takes her to the berth and the pilot gallies are charged in one tax from sea to the Berth and is as follows—
in summer months, from 1st of every April to 30th Sept. Cn. 80 / 600 Ham-
winter time, viz. from 1st of burg mean-
ing to 31st March Cn. 100 / 600

Vessels drawing less than 10 feet are charged for 10 feet.
Those vessels that take another pilot from the gallies, besides the cruising-pilot pay for the same according to the existing tariff.
In other matters the regulations hereto made are to be observed.
